Sixth Form Scholarships

The Sir Roger Fry Academic Scholarships

King's College awards a number of prestigious Sir Roger Fry academic scholarships to pupils who wish to study in the Sixth Form at King's College, Soto de Viñuelas, Madrid.

All applicants must complete the school admissions process for Year 12 entry, and be committed to completing their Sixth Form schooling in King's College.

Studies offered

These Scholarships are focussed on academic standards. Successful applicants should do well in the entrance assessment and interview, but they must also have an excellent Year 11 academic profile.

Duration of Scholarship

Two academic years' study in King's College, Soto de Viñuelas (2025/26-2026/27).

Value of the Scholarship

A full or partial scholarship equivalent to academic fees will be offered for both school years. The scholarships do not cover boarding accommodation fees, but can cover up to 100% of tuition fees only (not including charges, nor lunch or other extras).

Candidates who may apply

- Pupils who intend starting GCE A Level or IB studies in September 2025 having completed GCSE or (I)GCSE examinations or their equivalent in other educational systems.
- All applicants must take the competitive entrance assessment.

Applications from Non King's College Pupils

Public examination results should be submitted before the end of August of each academic year or immediately after the publication of results. Submitted results should be official: (I)GCSE equivalent results slip (photocopies by Notary or carrying current school stamp) for all pupils in English system or official end-of-year results for pupils not currently in the British system.

All applicants must speak English to at least B2/C1 level to access King's College School, Soto de Viñuelas.

Selection Process

Selection Committee

- All candidates' applications will be considered by a selection committee specifically set up by King's College.

Criteria

- The committee will consider all aspects of the candidate's application.
- A personal interview may also be required.
- The Committee will select candidates based on all the data received and will decide on the percentage of the scholarship to offer the candidate.

Final Decision

- Once a final decision has been made, successful candidates will be informed as soon as possible. For pupils in the British system, final confirmation rests on their official (I)GCSE results in August and meeting any conditions in the scholarship award letter.
- Unsuccessful candidates will be notified in writing as soon as possible.

Important Information

Scholarships are not transferable. If in the opinion of the selection committee there are no suitable applicants, no scholarships will be awarded.

Cancellation

In the event of "force majeure" prior to the award of the scholarships, King's College reserves the right to cancel the award process. "Force majeure" is defined as any event outside the control of King's College which would make the provision of scholarships impossible.

The Ignacio Echeverría Scholarship

In memory of Ignacio Echeverría, who showed courage and humanity during the terrorist attacks in London in 2017, King's College awards this academic scholarship for a student who has the necessary level of academic preparation to benefit from the King's College Curriculum and a genuine commitment to community work and voluntary service as evidenced from their application.

All external applicants must also complete the school admissions process for Year 12 entry. All applicants must be committed to completing their Sixth Form schooling in King's College.

Duration of Scholarship

Two academic years' study in King's College, Soto de Viñuelas (2025/26-2026/27).

Value of the Scholarship

A full or partial scholarship equivalent to academic fees will be offered for both school years. The scholarships do not cover boarding accommodation fees, but can cover up to 100% of tuition fees only (not including charges, nor lunch or other extras).

Candidates who may apply

- Pupils who intend starting GCE A Level or IB studies in September 2025 having completed GCSE or (I)GCSE examinations or their equivalent in other educational systems, who intend starting A Level or IB studies from September 2025 at King's College, Soto de Viñuelas.
- All applicants must take the competitive entrance assessment.

Documentation

All applicants should include a supporting document describing the candidate's activities and commitment to voluntary service and charity work. Possible activities may include school activities, community service contributions, charity work, volunteering adventure activities, etc. We require additional information to be submitted with the application.

Applications from Non King's College Pupils

Public examination results should be submitted before the end of August of each academic year or immediately after the publication of results. All applicants must speak English to at least B2/C1 level to access King's College School, Soto de Viñuelas.

Selection process

Selection Committee

- All candidates' applications will be considered by a selection committee specifically set up by King's College.

Criteria

- The committee will consider all aspects of the candidate's application.
- A personal interview may also be required.
- The Committee will select a candidate based on all the data and information received and will then decide whether to make an award for 2025-2027.

Final Decision

- Once a final decision has been made, successful candidates will be informed as soon as possible. For pupils in the British system, final confirmation rests on their August's official (I)GCSE results.
- Unsuccessful candidates will be notified in writing as soon as possible.

Important Information

Scholarships are not transferable. If in the opinion of the selection committee there are no suitable applicants, no scholarships will be awarded.
